Now a long time after, the master of those servants came back and went through his accounts with them. The man who had received the five talents came forward bringing five more. Last came forward the man who had the one talent. "Sir," said he "I had heard you were a hard man, reaping where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered; so I was afraid, and I went off and hid your talent in the ground. Another parable about the generosity of God. Even the one talent was a huge amount of money to give – the equivalent of twenty years' wages. God gives a lot to everyone – life, grace,

love. We do our best to share what he has given. He raises the people who invested their money well and made more.

Our man who kept the talent hidden was a fearful man — afraid of his master. Many people have some sort of fear of God. He gives much and expects more, they feel. They fear that he will punish them with poverty or bad luck or misery in many ways for not living a good life. God does not punish. For our sins, often it is life which punishes us. What we do for good or evil comes back on us. God believes in each of us — so much that this huge talent is given to us. God's belief in us gives us the energy to do the best with what we are given.

The gift of love is for sharing; gifts of personality, prosperity; all not to be hidden but to be given in a return of love. The language is exaggerated, and even the end is figurative. The meaning is to do the best we can with what we are given in life. God will see in each of us the good and faithful servant we are or try to be. Then there is an offer of more of his gift of love and forgiveness.

Lord may we do the best we can with what you have given us.
