Dear young people and parents/guardians,

The parishioners of Barryroe parish, and the six priests of our family of parishes, are keen to keep our young people connected with the parish's celebration of Sunday Mass.

To improve our parish's liturgical celebrations, and to keep our young people connected with Mass, we would like to invite sixth class pupils and secondary school students to read the intentions of the *Prayer of the Faithful* at Sunday and holy day Masses. Existing altar servers who have reached sixth class are very welcome to take part in this liturgical ministry also, although preferably not at the same Mass at which they serve. This liturgical ministry can be a part of the John Paul II awards which is for 16-18 year olds.

We envision the parents/guardians taking responsibility for preparing the rota among themselves so two young people are assigned to each Mass at 7.30pm Saturday evening in Courtmacsherry and at 10.00am Sunday morning in Barryroe, and to the extent possible at the vigil of holy days and on the holy day itself, and arranging for replacements when their child is not available. Either parents/guardians or the young people themselves would arrange to download and print the relevant *Prayer of the Faithful* ("Bidding Prayers") from the diocesan website (www.CorkAndRoss.org) which is updated with suitable intercessions a day or two before each Sunday or holy day. Printing is important because we avoid using electronic devices in the liturgy.

If you are interested in getting involved, please complete the sign-up form over the page and return either to the office in Barryroe National School, or to the parochial house (P72 XY19), or to the sacristy in either church, on or before Sunday 22nd September. After that date, parents/guardians will be contacted and a brief preparation session will be organised for the young people along with their parent/guardian present before we introduce the new practice. Thank you in advance for considering this initiative.
