You restored sight to the man born blind and opened the eyes of his faith; reveal your face to the dead who have not seen your glory.

**R.** Lord, you are our life and our resurrection. Lord, be merciful to us when we leave this earthly dwelling; make for us a home in heaven that will last for ever.

Lord, remember us in your kingdom, as following your teaching we say:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.
Thy kingdom come.
Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.
