World Day of Migrants and Refugees

The word of God cuts into our lives and challenges us to listen, even, if its message is tough. It is a word which promises a constant invitation in our lives to live more like Christ.





Sr Stanislaus Kennedy writes in the September Messenger for the Sunday for Migrants and Refugees.

Ireland is a nation which understands migration. For decades, we as a people have sought new lives outside Ireland which would offer us the potential to grow and prosper. Every family in Ireland knows this process – we all have a brother, sister, uncle, aunt, or indeed a child who has made a life for themselves in many other locations around the world. This Irish experience is the lens through which we must view the phenomena of migration as it impacts in Ireland.

Of those who have recently come to Ireland, their aims and motivations are the same as those of every Irish generation. Those in tents in Dublin city centre, refused accommodation by the government and left to fend for themselves, are no different than generations of the young Irish who arrived in Liverpool, or Boston, or Sydney in search of a fresh start. But the men, women and children who arrive in Ireland now are often fleeing active, violent and suffocating conflict and human rights abuses. They are coming from Afghanistan, Iraq, Sudan, Syria, Palestine, Ukraine, and other locations around this globe who do not enjoy safety and peace.

That we have reached a crossroads is undeniable, but it is not the crossroads that many would have you believe. It is not a time of saying 'That's it, we can't do any more', and it is definitely not a time for intimidation, abuse, protesting outside where people are living, or spreading lies and misinformation about those who come here. The crossroads we are at as a country is in how we go forward in our response to migration.

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
